

# SIT10216 - Certificate I in Hospitality

Current qualification



## Overview

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who participate in a range of routine and predictable hospitality work activities. They work under close supervision and are given clear directions to complete tasks.

This qualification provides a pathway to work in various hospitality settings, such as restaurants, hotels, motels, catering operations, clubs, pubs, cafés, and coffee shops.

Possible job titles include:

- bar useful
- food runner
- glass runner
- housekeeping assistant
- kitchen steward
- kitchen useful.

No occupational licensing, certification or specific legislative requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

## Entry Requirements

There are no specific academic entry requirements for this qualification.

Applicants for the Certificate I in Hospitality are expected to:

- Have a demonstrated capacity in learning, reading, writing, oracy and numeracy competencies to Level 1 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF). See [Australian Core Skills Framework](#).

The above requirements could be demonstrated by applicants in a variety of ways such as:

- Having completed secondary school to year 9;
- Verified references from an employer indicating that the applicant has demonstrated the above requirements in their workplace;
- Via an interview process that assesses the applicant's skills.

## Other Course Requirements

Students may be required to complete the written assessments outside of class time, which depending on the students underpinning knowledge, may be approximately 6-10 hours per week

Students must wear clean, non-synthetic (e.g. cotton) clothing including long pants and appropriate enclosed shoes
